A) Brown bear is actually a bear. All the others are misleading names. A Killer Whale is a member of the Dolphin family; a King Cobra is not a true cobra but has a Genus all of its own; a Flying Fox belongs to the Bat family; a Horned Toad is a lizard, and a Red Panda is not a Panda or even a bear. It is the sole member of the Ailuridae family; Pandas and bears are from the Ursidae family.

B) Roquefort is made from sheep's milk, all the rest are made with cow's milk

C) Hazelnut is the only true nut in the list. Botanically speaking all the rest are technically fruits, or in the case of the peanut a legume.

D) New England. It is not a US state but an area consisting of six states. All the others are actually US states that form New England, the missing one being Massachusetts.

E) Rhubarb is a vegetable, the rest are classed as fruits

F) Aaron. The rest are books from the Old Testament.

G) Taboo. The word comes from the Polynesian family of languages, the others came to English via the Indian sub-continent

H) Miss Dotty is from the Little Miss Books, the rest are from Charles Dickens' novels

I) Mr Bumble is from a Charles Dickens Novel (Oliver Twist), the rest are from the Mr Men series of books

J) The list is of premiership players who have scored the most own goals in the premiership. Jamie Carragher is the odd one out as he has netted more times for the opposition (6) than for Liverpool (3). All the rest managed to at least score more goals for their side than the opposition.
